



EVERGREEN SEEDLINGS bundles of 10 Bareroot \$7.50 per bundle.

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*) Fast-growing spruce reaches 6' in 6-7 years, with dense, dark green needles less than 1" long. Will grow to 125' in average soil; prefers some moisture, but not wet conditions. Makes an attractive landscape tree or a good windbreak. 10-24"

Serbian Spruce (*Picea omorika*) Fast, narrow, symmetrical growth to 50' high by 15' wide. Needles are short, flat, glossy green with white underneath (similar to a hemlock). Graceful drooping branches at maturity. Grows well in full sun to partial shade on well drained soils and tolerates urban conditions. Considered the best of the spruces for ornamental use. 10-12"

Eastern White Pine (*Pinus strobus*) Fast-growing native pine reaches 6' in 6-7 years, with soft, light to medium green 4" needles. Grows to 100' in a wide range of soil and moisture conditions, tolerates moderate shade. Excellent ornamental for specimen planting, naturalizing, windbreaks, and is used as a Christmas tree. 10-20"

Canadian/Eastern Hemlock Sold individually for \$2.00 ea. (*Tsuga Canadensis*) Slow to medium growth to a height of 70' high by 30' wide. Can tolerate a wide range of sun exposure from full sun to full shade. Works well for screenings and can be sheared to any height or shape. **This is the State Tree of Pennsylvania!** 4 yr transplant. 12-15"

DECIDUOUS TREES & SHRUBS sold individually as bare root seedlings \$1.25 ea.

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*) Fast-growing native oak can reach a height of 20' in 10 years and up to 80' at maturity with a rounded spread. Tolerant of a variety of soil conditions including urban plantings. Long lived and valuable as timber. Known for their display of red foliage in the fall. 10-24"

Red Bud (*Cercis Canadensis*) this native understory tree grows to a 30' height and spread. Named for the bright pink flowers that appear along its branches in spring. Its flowers and heart shaped leaves make it an attractive addition for landscaped and woodland areas alike. 8-18"

River Birch (*Betula nigra*) heat resistant native tree known for characteristic curling papery bark that brings variety to your landscape in all seasons. Species is known to be resistant to bronze birch borers. Grows in many soils and is moisture tolerant. Good choice for rain garden trees or for riparian plantings. 6-12"

American Cranberry (*Viburnum trilobum*) native shrub that grows up to 12' tall and produces bright red berries which birds, pollinators and other wildlife enjoy. Can be used as an accent or as a shrub screen. This shrub is moisture tolerant, making it a good choice for rain garden, wetland, and riparian plantings. 10-22"

Paw Paw sold individually \$4.25 ea. (*Asimina triloba*) a native tree gaining in popularity! This understory tree is known for large long leaves and its large edible fruit which appear on mature trees in late summer/early fall. Fruit has sweet custard like yellow flesh which tastes like banana, mango and cantaloupe. Grows in moist to well-drained soil in shade to full sun and typically reaches 20' in height. Host of **Zebra Swallowtail butterfly**. 18-24"

Lilac sold individually \$2.00 ea. (*Syringa vulgaris*) spring flowering shrub producing very fragrant, lavender colored flowers in mid to late spring. Grows vigorously in a bush reaching a height of 15' and up to a 10' spread. Light shade to full sun plant preferring moist soils. Use flowers for cutting. Can be planted as a shrub screen. 15"-18" bareroot seedling.

Fruit Trees Apples, Peaches and Cherries sold are bareroot, 4-6'tall

Apples \$16.00 ea. **

Honeycrisp is an exceptional variety that is extremely popular. Produces crisp, sweet red apples that mature in mid-September. Apples are considered all-purpose, but are most popular for snacking and salads. Among the best keeping apples. Excellent winter hardiness; moderately resistant to apple scab and fire blight.

Crown Empire is an intense red blush sport. It is very productive and a better annual bearer than other blush strains observed. Its crisp and juicy flesh is sweet like a Red Delicious and tart like a McIntosh.

** Apple Varieties listed require cross-pollination with a different apple variety plant within 100 ft to ensure pollination



Cherries \$18.00 ea.

Skeena Sweet Cherry This variety is large, firm, self-pollinating and tolerant to rain splitting. The fruit is juicy, sweet, of good eating quality with dark red to almost black skin. Fruit ripens in early July.

Blackgold Sweet Cherry Fruit is dark red and heart-shaped, good for fresh market and out-of-hand eating. The trees are self-pollinating, winter hardy and very productive. Fruit ripens in early July.

Peaches \$16.00 ea.

Coralstar is a large yellow-fleshed freestone peach with firm flesh and wonderful flavor. Holds well on the tree and in storage and does not brown when cut. Self-fertile tree does not require pollination. The tree is hardy and resistant to bacterial spot.

ORDERING INFORMATION

Dauphin County Conservation District (DCCD) is offering area residents the opportunity to beautify their property and improve the environment with trees and shrubs just in time for Earth Day and Arbor Day! We are offering evergreen and deciduous tree and shrub seedlings, fruit trees, flowering perennial plants along with blueberries, raspberries, and strawberries. Tree and shrub seedlings are bareroot; please refer to the order form for detailed information.

Payment: All orders must be prepaid - mail order forms with a check made payable to Dauphin County Conservation District. All orders and payments must be received by Monday, April 4th 2016. DCCD will charge a \$25.00 service fee on any check returned for insufficient funds.

When: All orders are to be picked up between 3:00 PM and 6:30 PM Thursday, April 21 or between 8 AM and 6:00 PM Friday, April 22. A pick up reminder notice will be mailed to you in early April. Please note that a \$5.00 service charge will be added to orders that are not picked up during the specified times, unless prior arrangements have been made.

Where: Dauphin County Agriculture and Natural Resources Center, 1451 Peters Mountain Road, Dauphin. Look for the bright green pine tree signs (*detailed directions are listed below*).

DCCD reserves the right to substitute a different size seedling for any species pending availability and severe growing conditions. If any one species is sold out, DCCD will refund payment for those seedlings not available. Survival rates of bareroot seedlings vary from site to site, from excellent to poor. We strive to provide the most viable seedlings available and all efforts are made to handle seedlings carefully to prevent root stress. *We strongly recommend closely following the planting guidelines for your purchase (available at pick up), as DCCD cannot offer a guarantee insuring tree survival.* Please keep this page for your reference.

From Harrisburg:


Travel Route 22/322 West to Route 225 North towards Halifax. Continue approximately 1 ½ miles on Route 225. You will cross Clarks Creek, and a 3B Ice Cream store on the left. Immediately after 3B Ice Cream, turn right into the Dauphin County Agriculture and Natural Resources Center.

From Halifax:

Travel Route 225 South towards Harrisburg. At the bottom of Peters Mountain you will pass Route 325 on the right. Continue a short distance on Route 225. Immediately before 3B Ice Cream, turn left into the Dauphin County Agriculture and Natural Resources Center.

Blueberries bareroot plants sold individually for \$10.50 ea.

Northland is a cross between highbush and lowbush species making it the most cold-hardy highbush variety grown – blossoms can tolerate light frosts. Medium size, dark blue fruit is firm with excellent, wild berry flavor ripening midseason. Grows 4' high with very ornamental brilliant orange fall foliage and a low, spreading habit. Heavy yields nearing 20 pounds per bush at maturity.

Patriot is an early variety that is vigorous and grows to a height of 4' to 6'. Adapts to many different soil types and has performed better in heavier soil than some other varieties. Has large fruit with very good flavor.

Raspberries bareroot plants sold individually for \$4.50 ea.

Heritage is a fall bearing **red** raspberry variety producing fruit of good size, color, and flavor. The crop is highly productive and ripens from the end of August through October. The fruit is good for jam and freezing and is delicious for fresh use, as well.

Royalty is the most popular **purple** raspberry variety. The fruit is large, of high quality, and is the sweetest of the purple varieties. Good for fresh eating and excellent for jams and jellies. Eludes spring frost damage, as it is a late- season variety.

Strawberries bundles of 25 bareroot plants for \$8.50

Earliglow vigorous runner and popular early-season variety known for its great, sweet strawberry flavor. Good for eating fresh or freezing. Recommended for beginners, this berry is resistant to various strawberry diseases.

Jewel large berries and superb flavor make this mid-season strawberry a popular pick. A consistent performer, doing well in a wide range of growing conditions, Jewel is a good choice for home garden growers.

Penn State Extension Master Gardener Program!

Specifically chosen to attract beneficial pollinating insects & birds.

“Moonbeam” Coreopsis blooms from June to August with creamy yellow flowers. This sterile cultivar of native coreopsis grows up to 24” tall. Enjoys full sun and well-drained soil. Heat and drought tolerant. Known to attract butterflies and other pollinators. 1992 Perennial Plant of the Year. **(quart container)**

“Goldstrum” Rudbeckia fulgida is a profuse bloomer from midsummer through fall with bright golden to orange flowers and contrasting brown center. An easy care **native** flower grows to 29” with a 23” spread. Attracts hummingbirds, butterflies, and other pollinators. Perennial Plant of the Year 1999. **(quart container)**



“May Night” Salvia x sylvestris will bloom early through mid-summer with numerous spikes of deep indigo violet-blue flowers which attract hummingbirds, butterflies and other pollinators. Perennial Plant of the year 1997. Heat and drought tolerant and easy care. Grows to a 23” height and spread. **(quart container)**

“Blue Fortune” Agastache provides long lasting, showy, blue-violet blooms from summer to fall. Blue Fortune is a hybrid of native wildflowers and attracts humming birds and HUGE numbers of butterflies and pollinators. Height 29” and 23” spread. Good alternative for the more invasive butterfly bush. **(quart container)**

“Magnus” Echinacea purpurea is variety of popular **native** wildflower with larger, more vibrant blooms than other varieties. Non drooping flowers bloom from summer to fall and attract humming birds, butterflies, and other pollinators. Height 39” spread 23”. 1998 Perennial Plant of the Year. **(gallon container)**

Milkweed Plugs: Host plants for feeding and reproducing **Monarch Butterflies**, a species of special concern due to reduction of wild milkweed habitat. Sold as a plant plug. Help provide habitat for this showy butterfly species! **(sold as plant plugs / 2.5” root ball in soil container)**

“Butterfly Weed” Asclepias tuberosa blooms with clusters of bright orange flowers in mid-summer. Prefers well drained soils, grows to 24” and attracts variety of pollinators and butterflies.

“Swamp Milkweed” Asclepias incarnata produces bunches of pink flowers in mid-summer attracting numerous pollinators and butterflies. Grows to 42” Tolerant of wet conditions, it’s a great addition to rain gardens or riparian plantings.

Tree shelters also increase the growth rate of young seedlings, even if the shelter is taller than the seedling. Available in 2' and 4' heights (use 4' where deer may browse seedlings). Not intended for use with evergreen seedlings. May be cut to fit over fruit trees for trunk protection.
